Amending the terms of the Amended and Restated CPC Operating Agreement effective November 1, 2005

TSX Venture Exchange Inc. (TSXV) operates a Capital Pool Company program (CPC program) pursuant to an Amended and Restated CPC Operating Agreement, effective November 1, 2005, between TSXV and the British Columbia Securities Commission, Alberta Securities Commission (the ASC), Saskatchewan Financial Services Commission, The Manitoba Securities Commission, Ontario Securities Commission, Nova Scotia Securities Commission and New Brunswick Securities Commission (the CPC operating agreement). The ASC is the lead regulator under the CPC operating agreement.

TSXV submitted an application (the application) to the ASC requesting an amendment to Appendix A of the CPC operating agreement. Specifically, TSXV requested that personal information forms (PIFs) filed under the CPC program be valid for the same length of time as non-CPC program PIFs (the proposed amendment). Currently, CPC program PIFs are valid for 18 months while non-CPC program PIFs are valid for 36 months.

Clauses IX.F.1, including Appendix D, and IX.F.3 of the CPC operating agreement state which individual in each jurisdiction may make amendments to the CPC operating agreement and provide a process for TSXV to request and obtain an amendment to the CPC operating agreement.

Staff in each jurisdiction had opportunity to provide comments to the ASC regarding the application and no objection to the proposed amendment was lodged.

Based on the application submitted by TSXV, the Amended and Restated CPC Operating Agreement, effective November 1, 2005, Appendix A is amended as follows:

- 1. in clause I.B.1.(c)(ii)(A)(I) "18 month period" is replaced with "36 month period", and
- 2. in clause II.A.4.(b)(i)(A) "18 month period" is replaced with "36 month period".

The amendments are effective as of April 30, 2010 date.
